1979 MEETING OF THE SOCIETY

The Eighth Hume Conference was held at Rutgers University on November 2-4, 1979. At the annual business meeting Craig Walton (University of Nevada-Las Vegas) was elected to the Executive Committee and Nicholas Capaldi (Queens College) and James King (Northern Illinois University) were re-elected to the Committee. Special thanks were expressed to the Program Committee members, Pall Ardal (Queens University), John Biro (University of Oklahoma) and Pheroze Wadia (Rutgers). The selection of a site for the 1980 meeting was delegated to the Executive Committee, while Trinity College (Dublin) was chosen for the 1981 meeting.

At the close of the meeting the Executive Committee designated Donald Livingston (Northern Illinois University) its Chairman and asked James King to continue serving as Secretary-Treasurer of the Society. Pall Ardal was named to fill the Member-at-Large position on the Executive Committee. Besides Donald Livingston, the other continuing members of the Committee are John Davis (University of Western Ontario) and Pheroze Wadia.

The Executive Committee lay the groundwork for the establishment of a special international committee of members of the Society who would serve as liaison to the scholarly communities of their respective nations. Donald Livingston and James King were asked to develop the structure of this committee.

NINTH HUME CONFERENCE

The 1980 meeting of the Hume Society will be held at Queens University, Kingston Ontario on October 24-26. The Program Committee for the Ninth Hume Conference includes Pall Ardal, John Davis and Louise Marcil-Lacoste (University of Montreal). Papers for the 1980 meeting should be submitted by June 30. Inasmuch as the Society subscribes to the principle of blind refereeing, authors should delete self-references from the body and notes of papers submitted. The customary reading length of papers accepted as part of the program of the Hume Conferences is 25 minutes. Four copies should be mailed to the Secretary of the Society, James King, Department of Philosophy, Northern Illinois University, DeKalb, IL 60115. (No copies will be returned to the authors.) Persons wishing to serve as commentators or as chairmen of sessions are invited to notify the Secretary.

It should be noted that the Executive Committee asked

James King to ascertain whether there is sufficient interest to schedule a session on the Hume's aesthetics as part of the Ninth Hume Conference. Persons to support such a session should address their suggestions and outline their possible contributions directly with Professor King. (This part of the program may involve invited as well as submitted papers.)

PROGRESS ON THE COLLECTED WORKS PROJECT

At the 1979 business meeting of the Hume Society, David Fate Norton (McGill University) remarked that the volume of papers from the McGill Hume Congress would be forthcoming in the Spring 1980. He also discussed plans for the project of publishing the Collected Works of David Hume, and observed that persons with a particular interest in working on some segment of this project may write directly to him at McGill University or to Tom Beauchamp at Georgetown University.
