The 1977 Meeting of the Society

The Philosophy Department of the University of Virginia has generously offered to host the 1977 meeting of the Hume Society which will be held October 27-29. The University is located in Charlottesville, Virginia which has an air terminal connecting Washington, D.C. and regular limousine to the University.

Jefferson's Monticello, which is a short drive from Charlottesville, and the University buildings designed by Jefferson are among the most beautiful examples of Colonial Georgian architecture in America. A dinner is planned for Friday evening in the University Rotunda which is elegantly appointed in the Georgian manner.

Papers should run no longer than thirty minutes and shorter if possible. Three copies should be sent to James King, Secretary-Treasurer, Hume Society, Department of Philosophy, Northern Illinois University, DeKalb, Illinois 60115. Members outside the United States who are not able to attend the meeting are encouraged to submit papers which if accepted will be discussed in a special session of the meeting. Only papers received by July 1 can be assured consideration.

Hume Portrait

The Society has had reproductions made of the Hume portrait by Louis Carrogis de Carmontelle recently acquired by the Scottish National Portrait Gallery. The portrait is a water color painted ca. 1765, measuring 7 3/4 x 13 inches. Hume is seated at a writing desk before a large open window in a rococo setting. The reproduction is in color and is a good copy of the original. Requests for the portrait should be sent to the Secretary together with a check for \$5.00 made payable to the Hume Society.

1976 Meeting: McGill Hume Congress

One hundred and sixty-seven scholars attended the Society's 1976 international meeting commemorating the bicentennial of Hume's death. The Society expressed its thanks to David Norton for the monumental task of organizing the meeting and to McGill University, the Canada Council, and the Quebec Ministry of Education for providing financial support.

1976 Business Meeting

The Chairman of the Society, Donald Livingston, conducted the election to fill vacancies on the Executive Committee of the Society. The two persons elected were : Ronald Glossop (Southern Illinois-Edwardsville) and Keith Yandell (Wisconsin-Madison).

James King read the Treasurer's Report, indicating that after disbursements connected principally with printing and mailing, there remained in the Society's treasury \$115.25 of the income deposited from dues received (\$590.00). The membership agreed to maintain the dues at their present level for the balance of the biennium.

Donald Livingston solicited suggestions for the meeting place of the Society at its future meetings. It was agreed that the 1978 meeting would be hosted by the University of Calgary and that the Society would endeavor to hold an international meeting at Bologna, Italy in 1979.

After the business meeting of the Society, the Executive Committee met and selected Terence Penelhum (Calgary) as its Chairman, re-elected James King its Secretary-Treasurer, and appointed Donald Livingston to the vacancy created by the resignation of David Fate Norton. Besides the two persons elected at the business meeting, the other members of the Executive Committee are ; Nicholas Capaldi and Peter Jones.
